Public Appearances:

Walter Thomas Jr. & Pamela Green- Renaming a street for their grandmother rescheduled for next month.

Johnnie, Shaunae & Michael Powell – Presented to the Council moving a mobile home on their property without a building permit. Ms. Johnnie Powell explained to the Council why the trailer was moved and where. B. Cullefer stated that needed to be brought before the zoning board. Now all building permits need to come before the zoning board. The property is only .28 acres, with a doublewide mobile home already there. They moved a second single wide onto the same property. The application was incomplete, no permit was issued, and no fees had been paid. Shanae Powell stated that Mr. Davis told her that it would go there. Mr. Davis stated that he told them that it looks like it will fit there but didn't tell them to put it there. He also stated that the Council has the power to rule however they want. C. Matthews – asked if someone tells you that it looks like it will fit on the property – What would that mean to you? F. Brown – stated that it would mean to me to put it there, but it should go before the zoning board and the Council. After discussion, a motion was made.

Reports from Dept. Heads:

1. Clerk – A. Holloway updated the Council on the zoom classes that she had attended about American Relief Funds. She stated that the City should receive half the funds this month. All the paperwork has been sent to the state. Brad Stovall stated that it was time to spray the sewage line before growing up again. I have been working on the current budget and the upcoming budget (both attached). We have

seen a decrease in the utility bill from CCA, around \$10,000.00. Mayor stated they are getting more female inmates now.

Mr. Davis also had a No Thru Trucks traffic sign, at the mayor's request, for the Council to approve. Chief stated that need another sign, and it must be advertised for thirty days in the local paper. Mayor asked the Chief to contact Bobby Steven Hauling to see if can get the trucks rerouted to Broad and MLK Jr. Street instead of Main and between Cotton and Chestnut.

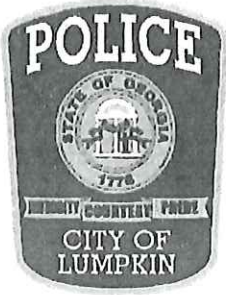
