

Reports from the Dept. Heads:

Clerk – A. Holloway informed the council that her update was in their folders. Did they have any questions? There were no questions from the council.

Public Works Supervisor – M. Robinson informed the council that his update was in their folders. He reviewed the update with council members. He told the council that American Tanks had cleaned out the Westville Tank.

Chief of Police M. Holloway informed the council that W.C. Bradley had donated \$55,000.00 toward a new police vehicle. He plans to get three new pickups.
